History of Burford

The name Burford derives from the old English word burh meaning fortified town of Hilltown and Ford, the crossing of a river. The town began in the middle Saxon period with the founding of a village near the site of the modern priory building. This settlement continued in use until just after the Norman conquest of England when the new town of Burford was built. On 17 May 1649, three soldiers who were levellers were executed on the orders of Oliver Cromwell in the churchyard at Burford following a mutiny started overpay and the prospect of being sent to fight in Ireland. Cornet Thompson, Corporal Perkins, and Private Church put up against the wall in the churchyard at Burford and shot. The remaining soldiers were pardoned. Each year 'levellers day' is celebrated in May the nearest weekend to the Banbury mutiny.

The Mermaid Inn

The Mermaid inn, formally known as the Three Pigeons. Our bar and grill looks very different from when it was built in the fourteenth or fifteenth century but still holds a lot of history. The Inn started as two different things on one side a butchers shop and the other the Inn, separated by one alley. Outside the front of the Inn, we still have the original butchers' blocks. After war world II, the Inn had a face lift and that was when the mock Tudor exterior was introduced to make the existing building look older than its original Victorian frontage.
